Table 1 Temporal reference of interruptions

Degree of criticality	Period of time until an interruption in vital services
1	Very long period (months, years)
2	Long period (weeks)
3	Medium-long period (days)
4	Short period (hours)
5	Very short period (seconds, minutes)

Table 2 Reference of extent of interruptions in services¹

Degree of criticality	Extent of interruption in vital services
1	Very small (0...10%)
2	Small (10...30%)
3	Medium (30...50%)
4	Large (50...80%)
5	Very large (80...100%)

The following formula is used for determining the degree of criticality of an activity of vital services:

The degree of criticality of an activity of vital services = (equals) the temporal reference of the interruption x (multiplied by) the reference of the extent of the interruption

The degree of criticality of an activity of vital services shall be assessed on the basis of the points thus obtained in accordance with Table 3.

Table 3 Degree of criticality of activities of vital services²

Criticality points	Degree of criticality
1-5	Activity is not critical
6-10	Activity is critical to a small degree
11-15	Activity is important, moderately critical
16-20	Activity is critical
21-25	Activity is very critical

¹ A service provider shall determine itself which indicator characterising the service will be used for calculating the ratio.

² On the basis of the achieved results, the critical activities with the criticality points from 6 to 25 will be determined. A risk assessment will be continued in respect of the latter.
